Governor Crist:

As Republican members of the Florida Legislature who voted no on Senate Bill 6, a bill relating to educator pay and evaluation, we write today to ask you, our Republican governor, to veto this legislation.

If this bill simply rewarded exceptional teachers with extra pay and offered new avenues to remove bad teachers, we could have voted in support.

While accountability in our schools is of the utmost importance, this bill, in its current form, violates core Republican principles:

- Local control is taken away and more power is given to the Florida Department of Education, an unelected bureaucracy;
- Educators who have worked hard to earn advanced degrees would not be compensated for those efforts;
- This bill does nothing to lower taxes, and in fact, the passage and implementation of this bill is contingent upon Florida receiving another \$900 million in federal stimulus funds;
- Serious fiscal questions remain as to how we will pay for this new state government program that requires the Florida Department of Education to hold back 5% of a local school district's funding every year;
- To avoid classroom cuts, school districts will have no option but to raise local taxes. Classroom funding should not be used to grow a new and bigger Tallahassee bureaucracy on the backs of taxpayers; and
- Most troubling, educators are being asked to accept all of the responsibility for the performance of their students. Tenets of personal responsibility, stronger families and individual freedoms should dictate that parents, teachers, and the students themselves should all be held responsible for the educational experience of each child.




