WHEREAS, Florida hospices have partnered with Children's Medical Services and Medicaid to develop Partners in Care: Together for Kids Program, the first publicly funded program that provides pediatric palliative care support services for children with potentially life-limiting illnesses; and

WHEREAS, Hospice-Veteran Partnerships (HVP) are coalitions of the Department of Veterans' Affairs (VA) to guarantee our nation's veterans and their families have access to excellent end-of-life care; and

WHEREAS, the month of November is a time to recognize and thank hospice staff and volunteers for the care they provide our loved ones;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ron DeSantis, Governor of the State of Florida, do hereby extend my support to all observing November 2019 as *Hospice and Palliative Care Month in Florida*.
